Part 1 : STORYBOARD THAT:

Directions: After you have finished reading your nonfiction book you will recreate some significant events using key details from the text using the program *Storyboard That*.

Use the **Getting Started guide** when you are ready to begin and follow all directions!

The story scene you create must include a minimum of 2 characters, and supporting details from your book... including appropriate dialog, and real information from your book. Of course you should use correct grammar, spelling, and punctuation.

The backgrounds, props, character styles/looks and images used should be carefully chosen to support your factual story.

Criteria Checklist

- [4 pts] A minimum of 4 true pieces of factual information must be conveyed.
- [2 pts] A minimum of 6 cells must be used.
- [2pts] A minimum of 2 characters must be customized and used for story
- [2pts] A minimum of 3 supporting props or objects must be used
- [2 pts] Appropriate dialogue is used by characters
- [2pts] Correct grammar/conventions of writing
- [2 pts] Correct punctuation and spelling
- [2 pts] Backgrounds customized to resemble story settings
- [2 pts] Unique and creative story

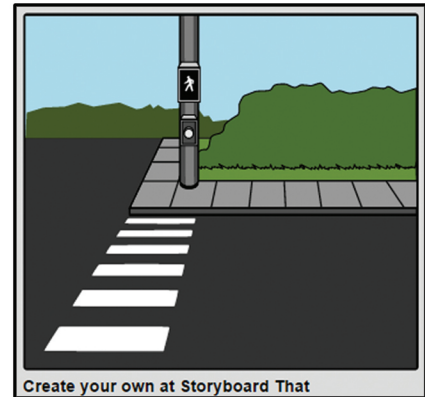
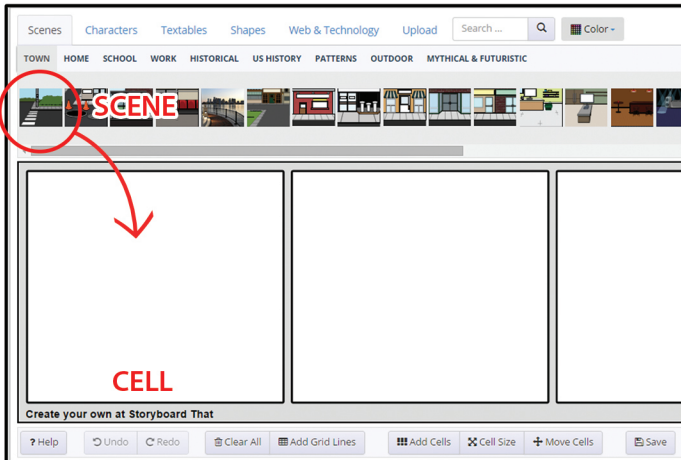


Using this guide you will quickly learn how to add scenes, characters, text and save. Let's get started!

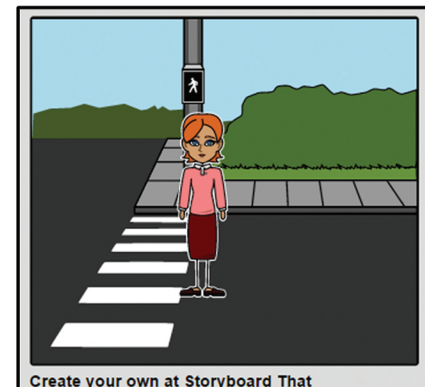
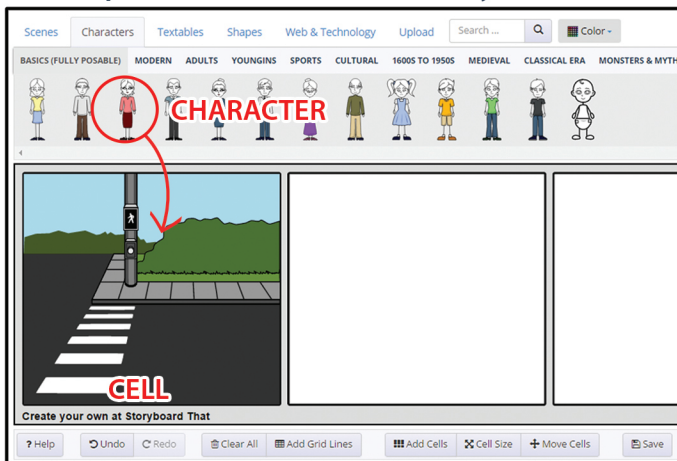
Click on **"Create a Storyboard"**

- Under **TOWN** click and drag the first **SCENE** into the first **CELL** of the storyboard. (Like the example below)



2.

- Click on the **CHARACTERS** tab located next to the scenes tab. Select a **CHARACTER** of your choosing, click, drag and drop them into the same **CELL** as your scene. (You can select colors and poses after being added.)



3.

- Click on the **TEXTABLES** tab and select a **WORD BUBBLE**. Click, drag and drop into the first **CELL** and place it next to your character. Type **"Hello!"** (You can resize the bubble by placing your cursor on the circles at the corners of the text bubble and dragging it for smaller or out for bigger)



Click on the **"Save"** button
